
**Saturday, March 22 @ 1 p.m. *Catherine Masud, international filmmaker*** p.m. presents her acclaimed movie, "**The Clay Bird**". Catherine produced and co-wrote the movie with her director husband Tareque Masud. *The Clay Bird (Monir Matta)* is a wrenching, yet humane depiction of one family's experiences in the violent upheaval leading up to Bangladesh's independence from Pakistan in 1971. The film won an International Critics Award at the 2002 Cannes Film Festival and was the first Bangladeshi film to gain significant worldwide distribution and to compete for a Best Foreign Language Film Oscar.

Catherine is an American-born filmmaker, residing in Bangladesh since 1995. She has collaborated with her husband & filmmaking partner Tareque Masud to make numerous shorts, documentaries and features, many of which have been nationally/internationally awarded and shown around the world. Since Tareque's untimely death in August 2011, Catherine has devoted herself to the archiving and preservation of his work, and the completion of their unfinished oeuvre.




